Again! Again!

What is the thing you enjoy doing most in your free time? Do you enjoy doing it again and again? Is there a book that you have read over and over again because it is so satisfying? Well, it's completely natural for all adults and children to want to repeat things that give them pleasure and are satisfying ... and that is why, when your children have really enjoyed the experience of having a particular book read to them, they will ask for it again ... and again and again!

Although being asked to read the same storybook for the fifth night in a row can make you want to weep, follow your children's lead. Wanting a book repeated is a sure sign that they are becoming hooked on books – whether they are 10 months or 10 years old! Recreate the magic for them by reading the book again because that story is emotionally satisfying for them. Emotionally satisfying experiences help us to feel motivated, and motivated children learn more easily.

If you are a bit tired of the same story, try to discover new things about it with your children. Here are a few ideas:

- Discuss the details of the illustrations with them. Allow them to express their ideas, by saying, "I wonder how/why/what ..." and asking open-ended questions like, "Why do you think ...?"
- Choose some words from the story to explore together. For example, let your children try to find words that rhyme, or together say words that might be in larger and bold print in big, loud voices and words in smaller print in soft voices.
- Ask your children what they think the author meant at different points in the story.
- Help them to make connections from the story to their own experiences and interests.

Through repetition, children absorb lessons about language, vocabulary and concepts. So next time you hear your children beg "Again! Again!", feel a sense of joy – you are helping them become readers!

Iyiphi into okuthokozela kokhulu ukuyenza ngesikhathi sakho sokuphumula? Ngabe uyakuthokozela ukuyenza ngokuphindelela? Ngabe ikhana incwadi oyifunde ngokuphindelela ngoba ikwenelisa? Empeleni, ikyinto ezenzekela ngokwemvelo ukuthi abantu abadala nezingane bafune ukuphinda izinto ezibathokozisayo futhi ezibenelisayo ... yingakho-ke, uma izingane zakho zikuthokozele ngempela okwenzekwa ezimpilweni zazo ngokuphatelene nencwadi ethile ezifundelwe yona, zizocela ukuphinelwa yona ... iphindwe, ibuye iphindwe futhi!

Noma ukucelwa ukuba ufunde incwadi yetindaba elanayo ngobusuku besihlani kufandelana kungakwenza ufune ukuthola, yenza lokho okufunwa yizingane zakho. Ukufuna ukuphinelwa incwadi kuwuphawa lokuthi zingenwa ufhando kwezincwadi - okunandaba noma zinenzinyanga esiyi-10 noma zineminyaka eyi-10! Phinda uzakhele lo milingo ngokufundelo incwadi futhi, ngoba indaba izenzwa zinenzeke emoyeni. Izinto ezisenza seneliseke emoyeni zisiziso ukuthi sikhuthazeke, izingane ezikhuthazile zifundo kalula.

Uma usuthanda ukuthathola yindaba elanayo, zama nezingane zakho ukuthola izinto ezintsha ngayo. Nonkho amasebo ambawo:

- Dingida iminininingwane yemidwebo nazo: Ziyumele ukuthi zizwakalise imibono yazo, ngokuthi "Kazi (kwenekwa) konjanu/(kwenowwa) ngobani/mgari ..." nokuzubizo imibozo engaba nezimpendulo ezining elana nokuthi "Kungoni nocabonga ukuthi ..."?



- Khetha amanye omagama asendabeni enizowacubungula ndawomye. Isibonelo, vumela izingane zakho ukuthi zizome ukuthola omagama amsindolana, noma nisho konyekonye omagama abholwe omakhu lu noma ogqomo, niphakamise amazwi, bese nehlisa amazwi emagameni abholwe omancane.
- Buza izingane zakho ukuthi zicobanga ukuthi umbhali ubethini ezindaweni ezahlukene endaben.
- Zisize ukuthi zikhumanele okwenzekwa endabeni nolokho okwenzekwa ezimpilweni zazo nezukufhandayo.

Ngokuphinda izningi, izingane zithola izifundo ngolimi, omagama nemigondo emisha. Ngokho ngokuzayo uma uzoa izingane zakho zikucela zithi "Tuthi! Tuthi!", yiba nomuzwo wenjobulo – uzisizo ukuthi zibe ngobafundi!
